WELCOME!

By participating in chorus, you will learn how to improve your singing voice and be educated in a variety of musical styles through performance of various types of pieces. Participation in chorus allows you to belong to a team where everyone is important. Chorus can provide you with many other long-term rewards and benefits that can affect you for the rest of your life. The discipline and individual practice time necessary to be successful in a large performing group will help each student be more successful in other academic areas and group situations. Therefore, the main goal of the choral music department is to use music as a vehicle that will help better prepare you for a productive, enjoyable, and successful future.

Performance Attendance Policy:

The most educationally fulfilling aspect of enrolling in a music performing group is participation in various performances throughout the year. As a result, the music department enforces the following policy with regard to performance and attendance:

- Students are required to attend rehearsals.
- ❖ In accordance with school policy, students must be in attendance at the beginning of the school day in order to be eligible to perform in a concert. Illness, oversleeping, illegal absence, and truancy exclude a student from performing in the concert. Examples of acceptable excuses include dental/doctor appointments, funerals, etc.
- Students who are absent from a performance, and unexcused by the director, will receive a zero for the concert participation portion of their grade for the marking period in which the performance occurred.
- * Excuses which are unavoidable, legitimate conflicts, will be considered by the director, *no later than two weeks prior to the performance*.

All excuses must be written and signed by a parent. Excuses for unseen emergencies will be considered at any time. It is the responsibility of each <u>student</u> and their <u>parents</u> to be aware of the performance schedule and provide excuses that are necessary in a timely fashion.

Performance Etiquette and Attire:

❖ Plan to dress nicely for concerts. Do not wear t-shirts, jeans, sneakers, boots, sandals. Ideally, for gentlemen, please wear a button up shirt, tie, long dress pants, and dark "dressy" shoes. For women, please wear a nice dress, dress pants, or skirt/blouse that covers the shoulders. If it's not appropriate for the regular school day, it's not appropriate for the concert. You want to look as good as you sound!

Grading System:

Rehearsal Participation: (40%)

Before Class:

- ❖ Be on time and come prepared to concentrate and work hard.
- Get your assigned folder and **pencil** from the folder cabinet that **you** are responsible for.
- No gum, no food.

During Class:

- Active participation is crucial to our success as a team. This includes being prepared with an open mind, a pencil and a willingness to try new things.
- Absolutely no cell phones on the risers! Phones and other devices will be kept in an auditorium seat with your belongings. If there are concerns about losing or misplacing your device, you will need to leave it in your locker. If found out, they will be confiscated and held to the end of the period for the 1st offense. Any further offense will result in them being sent to the principal's office.
- ❖ Good, responsible behavior.

Ending Class:

- Put your folder and pencil away in the folder cabinet.
- ❖ Do not leave belongings in the auditorium.

Concert Attendance and Participation: (35%)

- Students are **required** to attend ALL required performances. If a student cannot attend a performance due to illness or an emergency, the parent should write the teacher as per the Performance Attendance Policy (page 2).
- ❖ Concert participation is considered a final exam grade.

Performance Assessments (Rubrics) and Written Evaluations/Assignments: (25%)

- ❖ Voice Tests: Quartets or solos, singing a section of the assigned music.
- * Rubrics will be used to evaluate singing posture, behavior, breathing, tone, sight-reading and other music elements.
- ❖ Written evaluations or "Concert Critiques" after each concert.
- Quizzes and study guides may be used to assess students' knowledge of musical concepts.

Points	Rehearsal Participation Expectations
90-100	Student is always attentive, on-task, shows good behavior, prepared, on time, good effort, active participation.
80-89	Student is usually attentive, sometimes forgets materials, participates most of the time, puts forth acceptable effort.
70-79	Student needs repeated reminders to pay attention, disrupts rehearsal, rarely participates, often late, could improve effort.
60-69	Student is off-task most of the time, disrupts class and has a negative effect on others, displays little effort, parent-teachers meeting is recommended.
